Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CAREs) Act Federal Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

July 22, 2020

- Student must have been enrolled or will be enrolled as a non-high school curriculum student in at least one class during either the Spring 2020, Summer 2020 or Fall 2020 semesters.
- Student must complete either the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 (depending on the semester of enrollment) Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and be deemed Title IV eligible as defined by Section 484 of the Higher Education Act. Eligibility criteria includes the following:
 - Student is enrolled or accepted for enrollment in a degree, certificate or other program leading to a recognized education credential at an eligible institution of higher education
 - Student has a high school diploma or GED.
 - Student does not have a baccalaureate or first professional degree.
 - Student meets satisfactory academic progress, as applicable.
 - Student does not owe an overpayment on Title IV grants or loans.
 - Student is not in default on a Title IV loan.
 - Student, as part of the financial aid application process, filed a certification that includes a statement of educational purpose and social security number.
 - Student has a verified social security number.
 - Student is a U.S. citizen, permanent resident or eligible noncitizen.
 - Student returned fraudulently obtained Title IV funds, if convicted of or pled guilty or no contest to charges.
 - Student has not fraudulently received Title IV loans in excess of annual or aggregate limits.
 - Student repaid Title IV loan amounts in excess of annual or aggregate limits if obtained inadvertently.
 - Student registered with Selective Service, as applicable.
 - Student does not have a federal or state conviction for drug possession or sale, with certain time limitations.

- Student must have a BankMobile account set up to receive their disbursement.

- If a student's application is approved, disbursements are planned at least once every two weeks only after the student has either completed the enrolled courses or at least attended through the census date of the enrolled courses.
- Awards range from \$400 to \$900, based on either Spring 2020, Summer 2020 or Fall 2020 enrollment, as follows:
 - 1-5 credit hours: \$400
 - 6-8 credit hours: \$550
 - 9-11 credit hours: \$700
 - 12 credit hours or more: \$900
